

Tax Bills

SB 31 – Misc. Tax Credits

Exempts tangible or intangible property, property rights or property interests in or related to Pacific Northwest AC Intertie and referenced in certain agreements from property taxation. Applies to tax years beginning on or after date of execution of agreement and tax years beginning on or after July 1, 2005.

Provides that for purposes of business income apportionment, sale of goods shipped from public warehouse is not considered to take place in this state if taxpayer's only activity in Oregon is storage of goods in public warehouse prior to shipment or taxpayer's only activities in Oregon are storage of goods in public warehouse prior to shipment and presence of employees in this state is solely for purposes of soliciting sales of taxpayer's products. Applies to tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2006.

Allows residential energy income tax credit for construction or installation of solar electric system. Establishes maximum amount of credit that may be claimed in single tax year. Allows unused credit amounts to be carried forward to tax year that is not more than five tax years following first tax year for which any credit was allowed. Applies to solar electric systems certified for credit on or after January 1, 2006, and before January 1, 2016.

Establishes connection date to federal tax law. Disconnects from federal tax deduction for qualified production activities income, for 2005 and later tax years, and from federal tax exclusion for certain prescription drug plan subsidies, for 2008 and later tax years. Temporarily makes earned income tax credit refundable. For 2008 and later tax years, increases percentage of federal earned income tax credit allowed for state earned income tax credit purposes.

Creates income tax credit for rural emergency medical technicians, if certified by Office of Rural Health.

HB 2933 – Eliminates tax liability for members of the armed forces on active duty

Provides that outstanding income tax liability of taxpayer who died during performance of military active duty service shall be discharged. Applies to deaths of taxpayers that occurred on or after September 11, 2001. Provides that claim for discharge of liability may be allowed if filed on or before December 31, 2006.

Provides that outstanding income tax liability of taxpayer on military active duty shall be held in abeyance until six months after active duty ceases. Applies to unpaid tax liability incurred during periods of military service that occurred on or after September 11, 2001.

Allows rolling connection to federal tax law changes regarding combat zone compensation. Applies to tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2001, or any tax year affected by Military Family Tax Relief Act of 2003.

HB 3143 – Authorizes 10 new Enterprise Zones

Authorizes Director of Economic and Community Development Department to approve designation of up to 10 areas as urban or nonurban enterprise zones.

Eliminates population density limit for reservation enterprise zone designation.

Authorizes ports to apply to Economic and Community Development Department for designation of areas as enterprise zones. Establishes application procedures. Waives conditional taxes that would otherwise be imposed following disqualification from enterprise zone exemption, if reason for disqualification was destruction of property through fire occurring during certain period.
